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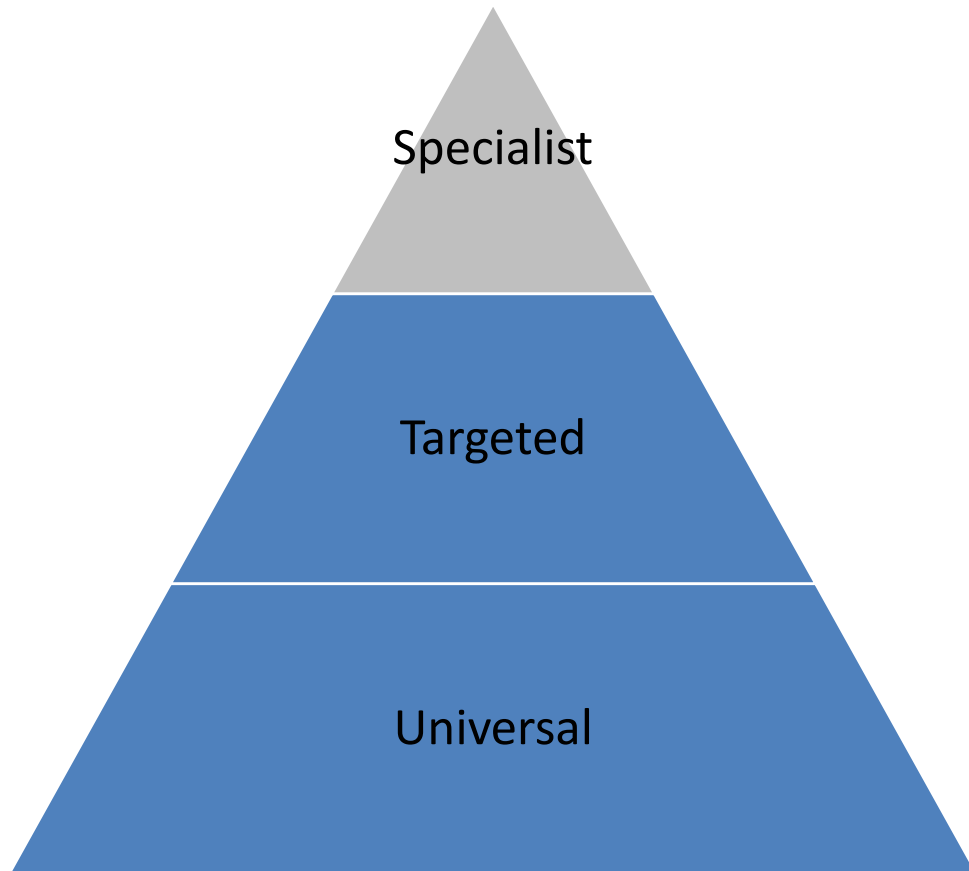
What is an Ordinarily Available?

Ordinarily Available sets out a common set of expectations about the provision and practice that is expected in all Early Years settings, mainstream schools and Post 16 providers for all children and young people with SEND.

It is what a parent or family can expect to be “normally” or “ordinarily” available to their child without the need for involving specialist support.



Pyramid of support



- **Specialist** – children who may need multi-agency assessment, planning and support
- **Targeted** – *some* children who will need “provision different from or additional to”.
- **Universal** – all children – high quality teaching – CoP “that normally available to pupils of the same age”
