WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO HAVE DEFIB MACHINES?

Defibrillators assist in providing protection against cardiac arrest, which affects over 140,000 people in the U.K. each year. When used within the first five minutes of a cardiac arrest chances of survival increase from less than 5% to over 80%



WHAT IS A DEFIB MACHINE?

A defibrillator or AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is a small portable device which has the ability to provide a life saving shock to someone who is suffering from cardiac arrest. The shock will 'restart' the heart and help it find an effective rhythm again.



HOW DOES A DEFIB MACHINE WORK?

A Defib Machine is easy to use and cannot provide a shock unless one is needed. The device will provide the person with a full ECG and check the heartbeat, if a cardiac arrest is detected only then will a shock be given. You cannot do any harm using it!



WHEN TO USE A DEFIB MACHINE

If somebody is found to be unconscious, not breathing and not responding you should always presume it is a cardiac arrest. Call 999 immediately and ask for someone to get you the defib as soon as possible. Once the defib arrives, press the 'on' button and follow the simple and easy instructions.



NEXT STEPS AND ABOUT YOUR DEFIB MACHINE

Your new defibrillator comes with a fully inclusive service and maintenance package. This means that everything around your new defib is taken care of for you.

INSTALLATION AND TRAINING

Each dealership will be assigned an Account Manager who will be in touch to arrange dates for installation and training. Training will be on-site and take approximately 30 minutes. It is recommended that all first aiders are present, but any other colleagues can also be trained should they want to.



ON THE DAY



Our engineer will arrive on site at the allocated time to install the device and provide training.



Your new Defib Machine will be installed in the service area, with full signage.



Training will then be provided and a register taken for those present. This will take approximately 30 minutes.



AFTER INSTALLATION



You will have the details of your account manager to contact for any ongoing questions you may have.



A quick visual checklist is provided to be carried out on a monthly basis which takes less than 1 minute to complete.



After 24 months a full service will be organised and carried out on the device, with refresher training.

AFTER USEAGE

Your new Defib Machine is covered by our exclusive replacement system.

If the device is ever used, simply contact your assigned Account Manager or call our free phone number on 0800 0852 733.

Your device will then be replaced for a new device within a day. If the device ever provides a beep, similar to a smoke alarm, you are also asked to contact us.
